

## **TRAVEL ALERTS**

### **Moldova**

Updated 2/25/2022

Moldovan authorities declared a State of Emergency for a period of sixty days in light of the regional crisis on from February 23rd. Moldovan airspace is closed for civil aviation until March 4th.

### **Iceland**

Updated 2/25/2022

All COVID-19 related travel restrictions have been removed in Iceland.

### **Belarus**

Updated 2/26/2022

Russian military operations are taking place in Belarus, and there is a high risk that military action may take place within the country. Routes out Belarus are limited, particularly by air. Travel to Belarus is not advised at the present time.

### **Belgium**

Updated 2/26/2022

If travellers are fully vaccinated, they can enter Belgium by completing a Passenger Locator Form (PLF). This is unless they fall under a very limited list of exemptions as listed on the Belgian Government website.

### **Slovenia**

Updated 2/26/2022

All travellers arriving in Slovenia must continue to complete the Digital Passenger Locator Form twenty-four hours before arrival, if entering via an airport or a ferry terminal. The form is not required if entering overland at a border crossing. On completion of the Passenger Locator Form travellers will receive a QR code which must be shown on entry. The link to the Digital Passenger Locator Form can be found on the Slovene Government Website.

## **Russia**

Updated 02/28/2022

The EU has announced that Russian aircraft are banned from operating to or from entering the EU's airspace. In retaliation Russia has closed its airspace to most European airlines. Passengers may experience delays and/or longer flight times, as the airlines adopt alternative routes to reach East Asia.

## **Ukraine**

Updated 02/28/2022

Foreign nationals who cannot safely leave Ukraine at this time should stay indoors and stay away from windows. They should remain alert to any developments that would allow them to leave safely. All Ukrainian males (including dual nationals) aged 18-60 are now prohibited from leaving the country.
